This workshop uses Audacity software. Audacity is free software for editing audio files. Please [download this guide](#) to installing Audacity on your computer. Audacity is available for Mac, Windows and Linux computers.

After we have received your online registration and payment, we will provide you with a link to download sample audio files to use at the workshop.

Assumed knowledge:

Participants should be confident with basic computer functions e.g. opening files, copying and pasting, and locating files on their computer. No previous knowledge of Audacity software is assumed.
